Thank you for participating in Australia's TSE surveillance program. Each year the program tests cattle and sheep with neurological signs. The negative test results provide evidence that Australia continues to be free of TSE diseases (such as mad cow disease and scrapie), which supports WA's access to domestic and overseas markets. The program is funded by the national sheep and cattle industries.
