



Financial support for purchasing eIDs for sheep and goats

The Tag Incentive Payment (TIP) scheme provides discounted electronic identification devices for producers of sheep and goats in Western Australia. Fully accredited National Livestock Identification System (NLIS) white eIDs for 2025 will receive a \$0.75 discount per eID via participating manufacturers. See your usual retailer.

The key aims of the TIP scheme are as follows:

- Reduce the upfront cost of eID tags for producers transitioning to eID tagging systems.
- Increase industry participation to maximise the number of sheep and goats with eIDs in WA.
- Support a smooth transition to the new eID system, allowing downstream operators to test eID scanning equipment.

Background

Australian Agriculture Ministers agreed to move toward the national implementation of mandatory individual electronic identification of sheep and goats, commencing 1 January 2025.

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development is coordinating this process in WA.

As the phased implementation of mandatory eID has commenced, livestock owners and operators are legally obliged to meet all National Livestock Identification System requirements.
