

Exemption of organisms and prescribed potential carriers, or classes of organisms or prescribed potential carriers, from the requirement to be presented for inspection upon entering Western Australia.

Under the provision of regulation 79(4) of the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Regulations 2013*, the following prescribed potential carriers are exempt from the requirement of regulation 79(5), in that they are not required to be taken to the nearest inspection point upon entering the state, and they are not required to be presented for inspection:

- New and unused machinery or equipment intended or manufactured for use in association with an agricultural activity or product, with animals, plant material or soil, or with mining or earthmoving (where 'new and unused' does not include refurbished or field tested).
- New vehicles, and used vehicles that do not contain fruit, vegetables, plant material, soil, animals or animal products (except those that are exempt).
- The following animal products:
 - Processed and/or cooked meats
 - Dressed carcasses
 - Butchered meat (cuts) for consumption
 - Leather items and goods, other than equipment used in conjunction with animals
 - Dairy products

The prescribed potential carriers described above remain subject to any import requirements published for those carriers or types of carriers.
